Who Can Be Where

■ The clubhouse is the players' sanctuary and is off limits to your fans. Only campers and camp staff have full access to the clubhouse, locker room, training room, batting cages, fields and dugouts. Restroom facilities are available for fans at the fields.

During lunch each day, fan package participants may go into the area where lunch is being served.

When games are over, your fans may go onto the fields for photos.

Please don't put our staff in the position of having to ask your fans to leave these restricted areas.

They can help you with pregame wraps and heat treatments, and postgame ice to help prevent injuries from occurring.
